
Meeting Agenda

### June 19, 2024 HOT Class. Sammy Long sammylong.com

Sammy will be instructing us on creative relief carving. This should be a great class, here is some more details on Sammy.

Sammy Long is a native of Greenville, Mississippi and a resident of Brandon, Mississippi. He is happily retired from many years of work in the gas pipeline industry. He began his career as a machinist and first learned to turn on a metal lathe as a young adult.

Sammy has been an avid student of the art for the past 16 years. When he returns from a class, symposium, or demonstration, he continues to study and practice what he has learned. Whether the demonstrator is a well-known artist or a local craftsman, Sammy is open to exploring new ideas or techniques. He comes back excited and enthusiastic about the next project. Once he has practiced what he has learned, he is always eager to share with his fellow turners. Those who have directly influenced Sammy's work have been John Jordon, Binh Pho and Dixie Biggs.

The second monthly Hands-On-Turning (HOT) is held on the third Thursday of each month, which is also our meeting night. For the next several months we are pleased to have the demonstrator for the meeting conducting these HOT classes. You can sign up for these classes by sending me an email. The following is a brief description. You might want to sign up early as they will likely fill up.

July 17 And August 7th 2-part HOT class. Charlie Levan and Katie Navaro

3-legged stool with embellishments. Well, this is too small to be a real stool, but it would serve quite well as a plant stand and the process could be scaled up to make a real stool.

Charlie will lead the July 17 HOT class in making the seat and legs. He will demonstrate how to drill the holes for the leg mortices and have prepared blanks with the holes drilled for the class. He will demonstrate turning a leg, duplicating a design he provides. The class can use one of Charlies designs or create your own. You can even have 3 different legs if you want. As usual, there will be a \$20 charge for the class which starts at 10 am and finishes at 4 pm.

Katie will use the August 7th HOT class to show us how to add embellishments to the stool.


In this class we will draw or trace a picture on the top of the stool, burn over the traced picture and color the picture with color wash paint. I will also show you how I textured Charlie's stool top with a micro carver. I will bring the paints I use to color wash which I will share with the class but if you prefer your own paints bring them. The paints I use are Tattered Angels Color Wash paints. They can be purchased at Hobby Lobby and online. I have two burners which I will bring to share. If you have a Colwood type burner, please bring it. You will need to bring

your own decorative paint brushes, an angle brush, a liner and a wide flat brush (no more than ½"). You will need a cup for water to wash your brushes and some paper towels.

#### June HOT Class 1

Our June Hot 1 class was led by Seth Gamba. The topic was making tops and shallow dishes to spin them in. Together, these two items make a great desk set.

The tops were made from maple. Seth discussed a variety of concepts related to top design and geometry. The goal was to turn a top that is easy to spin and will spin for a long time. Tops are a great vehicle to experiment and refine your spindle turning.

The dishes were made from 'Satin Walnut' sweet gum.

Seth showed his CA finishing method on the dishes. They need to be very smooth and resilient against scratching. CA provides a very hard finish that can stand up to some abuse
