The September HOT I class on September 4th was led by Wayne Johnson. The topic was turning a platter or plate. The attendees were given an 8"x 1 1/16th" round platter blank and turned a plain platter or plate to get familiar with the turning techniques. Then the attendees were given 10"x 1 7/8ths" platter blank to turn a platter with 2" wings that flow into a shallow bowl. Our focus was on turning but we also reviewed how to burn the edges or paint the edge of a platter, how to decorate the 2" wing with Basket Illusion beads that are colored, and use a weave pattern or just highlight with a single bead. We also discussed how to put an image on a platter. Wayne gave an interesting presentation and focused on using just a few tools to turn a platter or plate.

Lantern Ornament

with Mike Peace

We will turn a Lantern Ornament. Come and enjoy some fun and fellowship with your turning buddies! And maybe even learn new and creative techniques in woodturning. No skill prerequisites required, come as you are. Here is a <u>video</u> I did on this project: Woodcraft has tools available for participants to use but we encourage you to bring your own tools to learn to sharpen and because you may be more familiar with them. For this project, I use a parting tool, a spindle gouge, a spindle roughing gouge, a box scraper, a point tool and a texturing tool.



Mike Peace was one of the original members of AWG, attending the first meeting in Sep 2007, the first year he started turning! He has demonstrated at the American Association of Woodturners symposium in Atlanta 2016 and Portland 2018, as well as regional symposia and many clubs in the USA, Canada and the UK via Interactive Remote Demonstrations. He has taught at Woodcraft and the John C. Campbell Folk School. Mike has published articles in American Woodturner, Woodturning FUNdamentals, More Woodturning, Woodturning Design, and Woodturning. He uploads a woodturning video, usually weekly, to his YouTube channel, Mike Peace Woodturning, where he has more than 760 woodturning videos. Mike retired from ADP as a payroll software project manager. After serving on active duty in the US Army, Mike stayed active as a reservist retiring with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. COUNTY WICKLOW

County Wicklow is the last of the traditional 32 counties, having been formed as late as 1606. It is a region in east Ireland, south of Dublin. DID YOU KNOW? -

One of the most expensive woods in the world is Grenadil, African Blackwood (Dalbergia melanoxylon). The color of dense, shiny wood varies from red to pure black. Usually, Grenadil is sawn into small logs, leaving a bright yellow sapwood to avoid cracking during prolonged drying. It is mainly used for making musical instruments. However, now it is an endangered species that is classified as a flowering plant and usually grows in the arid regions of Tanzania and Mozambique. To grow into an adult, a tree needs up to 60 years.
