AWG hosts Kevin Wood for August meeting demonstration

During the past couple of years Kevin Wood has begun turning "Live Edge Winged Bowls". Kevin shared some of the process steps and decision-making he uses to create his work with us at the August 2019 AWG Club meeting. Kevin uses green wood blanks to create these bowls. Over the course of his projects he has learned what works in regard to blank selection and prep, blank mounting, work speed, finish level of cut to minimize sanding after drying is complete, drying times and techniques that yield reasonably predictable results, and a myriad of other details that help form a successful outcome. It was fascinating to watch the winged bowl emerge from the blank during Kevin's demonstration. Here ae some photographs that capture the work involved.

As part of this marketing venture AAW is working with Rockler to plan a local Pen Turning event and they are excited to offer an opportunity for chapter involvement. The event will include pen turning hands-on classes in both of our Atlanta area Rockler stores on **Saturday, November 9, 2019. Classes will be held at 9:30 am, 1:30 pm and 3:30 pm.**

AAW has invited our chapter to provide some assistants for some hands-on pen turning classes. This event will be an excellent opportunity for our representatives to talk about woodturning, our chapter, and AAW membership. We're requesting at least a two hour commitment, between the hours of 9 am and 5 pm, starting at 9am, 11am, 1pm, or 3pm. We can use some pen turning instructors and also some general talking head marketing chapter representatives. If you are interested in volunteering, there will be a sign-up sheet passed around at the September and October meetings, or you can contact Kim Muthersbough at kmuthers@kennesaw.edu and let him know your volunteer preference - what store (Sandy Springs or Kennesaw), whether or not you'd like to be a pen turning instructor or a marketing chapter representative, and your requested time. There is a need for 3-4 folks to cover each store, similar to what was done last year.

This is the second year Rockler has held this event. Turning participants are charged \$10 fee and proceeds being donated to National Veterans Foundation. Last year just under 550 participated across the locations in the Rockler organization.
