HOT Sessions Hands On Turning

Hot Class - June 1, 2022

Back to Basics

Our June HOT topic was a Back to Basics. Katie Navarro facilitated the class and taught the Mark Sillay method of wood slicing. The class was attended by seven participants. All were eager to learn what Katie was teaching.



Katie began by providing an outline of the objectives of the class.



Then she started by demonstrating how to sharpen their spindle gouge to allow for deeper penetration into the spindle. Then each student was given the opportunity to sharpen their gouges with Katie there to help them if needed.

Next, we learned the proper way to turn beads, coves, flats, discs and points. Katie started by demonstrating each cut, one at a time. And then the students were given the opportunity to practice the cut on their own piece of ripped 2x4's. We worked our way through each cut. Katie was busy checking with each participant to see how they were doing and to offer help, suggestions as needed.



We finished by making a bird house which utilized all of the cuts, beads, coves, flats, discs and points.



Each of the students showed improvement in their turning skills and came away with usable skill and knowledge improvement. Everyone was encouraged to advance their skills by practicing these cuts regularly in their own shop.



We were unable to accommodate everyone who wanted to take the class and hope to schedule another one in the near future. If you are interested in a future Back to Basics class, please contact Katie.

Laser for hollow turning: After going through half a dozen laser pens while hollow turning with my Jamieson system, I purchased a universal pistol laser and attached it to an Allen wrench and then slid the wrench into the pen slot. The pistol laser can handle the shocks associated with the hollowing process. I purchased the pistol laser on eBay for under \$20. —Robert Jay, Collingswood, NJ

2022 AAW Symposium, Chattanooga, TN June 23-June 26, 2022

I hope all of you are looking forward to attending the upcoming AAW Symposium in Chattanooga June 23-26. With over 100 demonstrations, 100+ vendors and an Instant Gallery display of 1,000's of items, there is something for everyone. Volunteers are very important to the success of the symposium, so please consider signing up for one or more volunteer positions. Just go to woodturner.org and click on the symposium information, volunteer opportunities and register with Sign-Up Genius.

The AAW has two charitable events at each Symposium: Empty Bowls and Beads of Courage.

Empty Bowls: AAW members make and donate wood turned bowls (or other turned items), that are sold during the Symposium for only \$25. For 2022, 100% of the proceeds will support Friends of Special Children (FOSC), an organization that works to improve the lives of special needs children of all ages in and around Chattanooga. FOSSC helps to support Signal Centers School, which offers day programs and referral services for children and adults with special needs. Make and donate one or more bowls (or other turned items) to Empty Bowls: Take your donations with you to the AAW Symposium and drop them off at the Empty Bowls booth in the Instant Gallery/Exhibitions Hall.

Beads of Courage: AAW members create and donate wood turned boxes for Beads of Courage. The boxes are displayed in the Instant Gallery/Exhibitions Hall. Through Beads of Courage, children receive a unique bead to represent each medical procedure or treatment. For example, a red bead for each blood transfusion, a yellow bead for each night in the hospital, a star bead for surgery, a white bead for chemotherapy. Their collection of beads becomes a tangible record of their journey. Each wood turned box will hold a sick child's precious beads. Make and donate one or more turned boxes to Beads of Courage.
