Hands On Turning HOT Session

On November 2nd we met at Woodcraft for this month's HOT session. This month's topic was bird house ornaments, and it was led by Mike Peace, with Dan Douthart assisting Mike. The session was mostly full of participants each eagerly looking forward to learning Mike started us off by demonstrating how to turn the roof and then the body. He gave helpful hints on how to choose the wood we would use

Mike then turned us lose to go to our lathes and begin the process of turning our lids. Throughout this process, Mike and Dan monitored our progress and provided tips and tricks and suggestions regarding how to turn better.





We each completed turning our roofs and applying a finish. We then moved on to the body of the bird house. Mike gave us the measurements to drill the body and for the tenon that would be necessary. We "snuck up" on the fit. We drilled a hole for entrance and again put a finish on

the body.





Once our roofs and bodies were completed, we moved on to turn a finial and put a finish on it. Then we assembled all the parts and took a class picture which I am sure we will all review and remember at our ten-year reunion.

November's Featured Demonstrator

Casting and Turning wood and Resin Creations by AWG Member Jim Rowland



Jim started turning in 2018 and has been turning as much as possible since then. He began working with epoxy resin about two years ago and loves the results that can be achieved by combining wood and resin in a turning. Jim does his turning at the Roswell Firelabs, where he has taught several people the basics of turning. Before his new career in wood turning, Jim was a Program Manager in defense and technology industries including BAE SYSTEMS, Ultra Electronics, ViaSat and others.

Jim will present the process for casting and turning wood and resin creations based on Jim's own hard lessons learned. The discussion will include practical tips for choosing the epoxy resin, choosing the wood, creating the casting mold, the curing process and when pressure/vacuum is appropriate, tools for turning epoxy resin and

finally the finishing process and options for final finish.





Beads of Courage

The Beads of Courage Organization has guidelines regarding the size and shape of the box to be made. I have listed those guidelines below, taken directly from their website. Please contact me glenwithrow@gmail.com or phone or text: 770-845-1434, with any questions or if you have a bowl to donate.

BEAD BOWLS/BOXES GUIDELINES: Beads of Courage members may receive thousands of beads. It is desirable for your boxes to hold them all. As a result, turned or rectangular lidded boxes need to be large. Larger is better!

Recommended interior dimensions for turned boxes are: 6" diameter (5" min.), 5" height (4" min.). Recommended interior dimensions for flatwork boxes are 4"x6"x4"

Box bases should be wide enough so the box is stable and does not tip over easily. Lids for Beads of Courage boxes should be easy for small or ill children to remove or lift. Any finials should be easy for a small child to grasp and not too elaborate so they don't break. Avoid excessively elaborate designs that may easily break or be damaged; remember, hospital rooms have limited storage space. Finishing of boxes is extremely important! Beads of Courage members who receive these boxes are susceptible to germs/ infections/mold. Bowls that have not been properly sealed can harbor mold. Please take the time to ensure you are using a safe finishing process that does not contain toxic materials. Also do not use finishes like linseed oil that take a long time to outgas. All kinds of wood are beautiful! Please refrain from painting Beads of Courage boxes. Instead, highlight the beauty of the wood with clear varnish, a stain, and/or burning.





Glen is a member of the AWG as well as several other woodturning clubs in the area and will be the Beads of Courage coordinator for all of these clubs.


