The session was led by our own Hans Meier. Hans taught us how to turn Rolling Pins.





Making and Using Specialty Turning Tools

The Atlanta Woodturners Guild is pleased to be back in Woodcraft for our 2023 series of meetings and programs. Mark Sillay will start us off in January. The meeting will be on January 18th. Mark has a wealth of turning knowledge to share. Mark's demonstration will feature a collection of tools he has created to improve productivity, enhance safety, and produce the results he wants from his turnings.

Many manufacturers market tools created for general use. Making those tools more productive and fit special uses is what Mark will demonstrate. He is planning on bringing a range of specialty tools he has created. He will explain how he has made them and of equal importance, how to use them to improve your turning productivity, safety, and outcomes.

Mark enjoys recycling native Georgia woods He loves using the lathe to transform recycled woods into useful items and artistic objects. Being basically self-taught on the lathe, over the years, he has advanced his woodturning skills. After turning many basic bowls, etc., he found a desire to create smaller and finer turned objects. He credits Cindy Drozda (www.cindydrozda.com) with inspiring him to transform his woodturning life into a joyful journey. He has shared that journey with many students and as a result, has touched many of us in the turning community.

Feel free to take photos and videos of the tools Mark will demonstrate. He will take any and all questions as he demonstrates how he has created and uses a collection of specialty tools. Mark's emphasis will be on improving your skills and enhancing the safety of all turners. I hope you can join us as we kickoff 2023.

Beads of Courage

This is reprinted of a previous article penned by Glen Withrow. Glen is spearheading the club's effort to provide Beads of Courage Bowls to those in need. To be successful each of us will need to turn some bowls to be donated. As some of you probably know, turning a bowl can be challenging and rewarding at the same time.

The Beads of Courage Organization has guidelines regarding the size and shape of the box to be made. I have listed those guidelines below, taken directly from their website. Please contact me glenwithrow@gmail.com or phone or text: 770-845-1434, with any questions or if you have a bowl to donate.

BEAD BOWLS/BOXES GUIDELINES: Beads of Courage members may receive thousands of beads. It is desirable for your boxes to hold them all. As a result, turned or rectangular lidded boxes need to be large. Larger is better!

Recommended interior dimensions for turned boxes are: 6" diameter (5" min.), 5" height (4" min.). Recommended interior dimensions for flatwork boxes are 4"x6"x4"

Box bases should be wide enough, so the box is stable and does not tip over easily. Lids for Beads of Courage boxes should be easy for small or ill children to remove or lift. Any finials should be easy for a small child to grasp and not too elaborate, so they don't break. Avoid excessively elaborate designs that may easily break or be damaged; remember, hospital rooms have limited storage space. Finishing boxes is extremely important! Beads of Courage members who receive these boxes are susceptible to germs/ infections/mold. Bowls that have not been properly sealed can harbor mold. Please take the time to ensure you are using a safe finishing process that does not contain toxic materials. Also do not use finishes like linseed oil that take a long time to outgas. All kinds of wood are beautiful! Please refrain from painting Beads of Courage boxes. Instead, highlight the beauty of the wood with clear varnish, a stain, and/or burning.





Glen is a member of the AWG as well as several other woodturning clubs in the area and will be the Beads of Courage coordinator for all of these clubs.
