Kip had some participants from the audience cut out a vase they considered to be good form from paper and then had the remaining members of the audience choose the paper vase with the best form. Kip used calipers to measure and duplicate that form on the lathe. He showed us how to look for egg shapes in the curves of an object since eggs are considered to be the perfect natural object in nature.

She will also demonstrate how to make a silicone mold and pour pewter to create a peach pit to go underneath the lid of the box. Christine will then demo how she paints the peach with acrylic washes. She even coats the inside of the box with peach scented infused beeswax she makes herself.

DID YOU KNOW? -

One of the most expensive woods in the world is Grenadil, African Blackwood (Dalbergia melanoxylon). The color of dense, shiny wood varies from red to pure black. Usually, Grenadil is sawn into small logs, leaving a bright yellow sapwood to avoid cracking during prolonged drying. It is mainly used for making musical instruments. However, now it is an endangered species that is classified as a flowering plant and usually grows in the arid regions of Tanzania and Mozambique. To grow into an adult, a tree needs up to 60 years.
