






To all AWG members:



HOT I News:

June HOT 1 Session

The June HOT 1 session on June 4th and was led by Mike Peace. The topic was turning a small cylinder box, including the hollowing for the base and lid by drilling a hole for the base and a 1/8" larger hole for the lid and creating a long, piston fit tenon. Mike also demonstrated using texturing tools to create texture patterns on the box. The result was a small box that could be a pill box, a needle case or toothpick holder. The class was well attended. Each attendee completed at least one pill box which will be seen at the June meeting.

Thanks to Mike for providing great demonstrations and individual help on this project.



There will be no July Hot I session since it is so close to the July 4th holiday.

HOT Aug 6, 2025

Mike Peace will facilitate our HOT session on **making a small** round tool from a HSS tool blank. Mike's favorite is the point tool, a very handy tool for making small beads and Vee grooves and more. Options also include a round skew, cove tool or cat's claw for making small captive rings. The difference is how you grind the tool profile. There will be instruction on how to use your new tool and an opportunity to practice. All materials will be provided.



HOT Sept 3, 2025

Marcus Jones will facilitate our Hot session making pinecone Christmas ornaments. The session will include turning a pinecone shaped box, glueing the lid to the box and then carving and texturing it to make a pinecone. The pinecones can be finished naturally or stained or painted. The ornaments can also be decorated using pyrography rather than carving.

The Art and Evolution of Wood Turning
