AWG invites you to its monthly meeting on July 16th.

For the July meeting of the Atlanta Woodturners Guild, our own Seth Gamba will demonstrate his process for getting fine, high-gloss finishes using CA glue. In this demonstration, he'll go over the steps and materials to get from raw wood to a perfect finish.

Seth is an Atlanta native and Orchestra teacher for Fulton County schools. He turned a piece of wood for the first time in 2018 to make a part for his son's Pinewood Derby car using an old lathe that had been disassembled in his father-in-law's garage for over 40 years. After spending most of a week getting that machine working to make a tiny part, Seth decided he better find out what else it could do. Since then, he's built his skills and his shop to the point that turning has become a profitable side business called Low Note Woodwork.



The difference is how you grind the tool profile. There will be instruction on how to use your new tool and an opportunity to practice. All materials will be provided.




HOT I Sept 3, 2025

The session will include turning a pinecone shaped box, glueing the lid to the box and then carving and texturing it to make a pinecone. The pinecones can be finished naturally or stained or painted. The ornaments can also be decorated using pyrography rather than carving.

DID YOU KNOW?

Here's a fascinating little twist about manual woodturning lathes: some of the earliest versions—like the **spring pole lathe**—relied entirely on human power and rhythm. A turner would press down on a foot treadle, causing a flexible pole (often a sapling) to bend and spin the workpiece. As the pole sprang back, it reversed the rotation—meaning the cutting could only happen on half the cycle. It was a true dance of timing and patience!

The magic here? Despite being low-tech, these lathes allowed craftsmen to produce everything from chair legs to ornate candlesticks with incredible precision. There's even a resurgence of interest among modern woodworkers who love the tactile connection and meditative pace of manual turning.
